Why is the Day of the Dead celebrated?

It is to demonstrate love and respect for deceased family members. ... Día de los Muertos, or Day of the Dead, is a celebration of life and death.

While the holiday originated in Mexico, it is celebrated all over Latin America with colorful calaveras (skulls) and calacas (skeletons). Celebrated Oct 31-Nov 2 is coincides with All Souls Day or All Saints Day and Halloween.

Mexicans have been honoring Day of the Dead, (or All Souls Day and All Saints Day as it's also known by Catholics) for thousands of years. It's based on two principles in particular: One, it celebrates the lives of people who've passed away and two, it's about reminiscing with friends and family, among brightlycolored decorations such as luminous marigolds, strands of hanging papel picado, and ornate calacas (spirited skeletons).

Because Day of the Dead, follows Halloween, some people might conclude that Dia de los Muertos is an evil holiday in which Mexicans praise death. That couldn't be further from reality, as we are to rejoice the lives of those we love and who are no longer on Earth. People also celebrate with huge parties and carnivals to give thanks to our own lives and those who are still around us.
