The Moon is the only natural satellite of Earth:

orbit: 384,400 km (238857 miles) from Earth  
diameter: 3476 km (2169 miles)

As the Moon orbits around the Earth once per month (every 27.3 days), the angle between the Earth, the Moon and the Sun changes; we see this as the cycle of the Moon's phases.

The time between successive new moons is 29.5 days (709 hours), slightly different from the Moon's orbital period (measured against the stars) since the Earth moves a significant distance in its orbit around the Sun in that time.

- Pantego

- Though settlers arrived there around 1860 during the Civil War times, it wasn't until 1884 that Frederick Foscoe donated the land for the first school and wanted the town named after Pantego, a Caddo Indian who assisted some of the early Anglo settlers in eastern Tarrant County, Texas. The official name is "Town of Pantego". Pantego was completely surrounded by the city of Arlington by 1989 and remains predominantly a residential community.

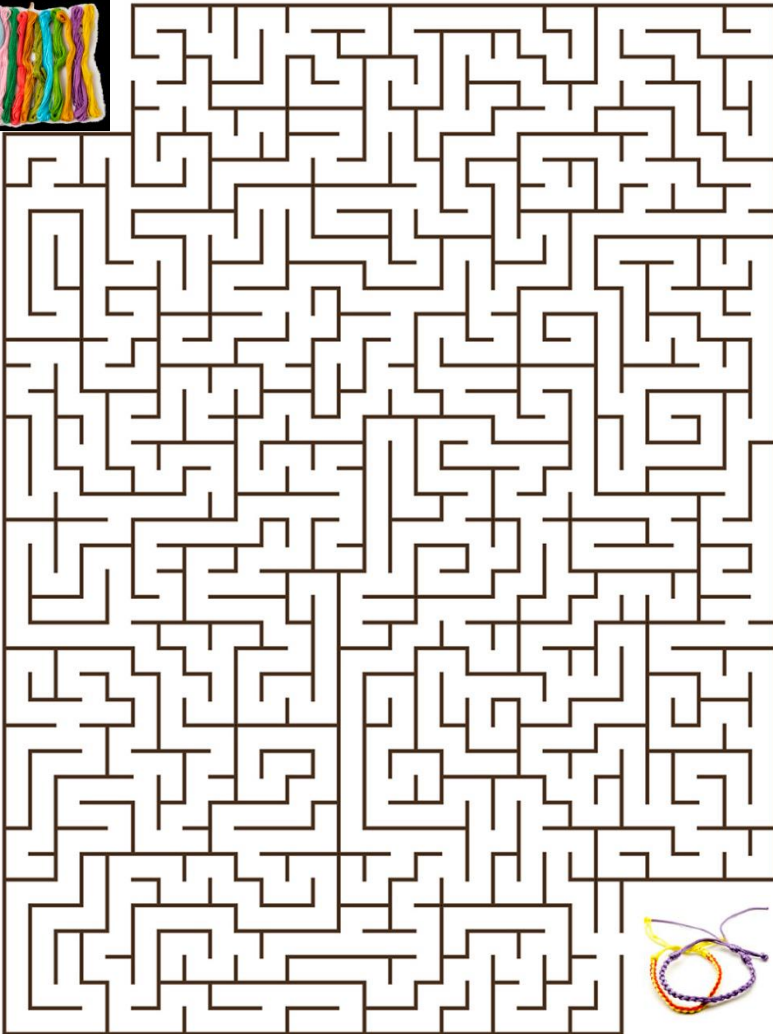

### More useful Tips

#### Reducing Static Cling

**The Arctic**, where the North Pole is, is an ocean surrounded by landmasses. Here, you might find animal life such as polar bears, reindeer, and foxes. While many people think snow when they hear "Arctic," in fact much of the Arctic is tundra (treeless plains characterized by low shrubs; black, mucky soil; and, deeper down, permanently frozen soil) and boreal forest (woodlands made up mostly of evergreen trees and shrubs that bear cones, such as pine cones). A wide variety of plant life can survive in the Arctic, including mosses, lichens, and hundreds of flowering plants.

By contrast, **the Antarctic**, where the South Pole is found, is a continent surrounded by oceans. While the Arctic is cold, the Antarctic is even colder—only 2 percent of it is not covered by ice. Temperatures there have been recorded as low as -128.6 ° F, (-89.22 ° C)! It is so cold that there are only two species of flowering plants that can survive. But many animals live here, such as penguins and many species of seals and whales, including the orca, or killer whale.
